

**UVA Board of Visitors Meeting – Notice regarding Tuition and Fees
Tuesday, November 5, 2019**

The UVA Board of Visitors will consider 2020-2021 tuition and fees for the University of Virginia and the University of Virginia's College at Wise on December 6, 2019 at 8:00 am in the Board Room of the Rotunda. This notice is provided in accordance with §23.1-307(D) and (E) of the Code of Virginia requiring 30 days notification. 2020-2021 Incremental Revenue: Revenue generated from these tuition and fee increases, coupled with cost savings, philanthropy, endowment earnings, and other revenue sources, will address faculty and staff compensation, investments in academic programs, expanded student health services and facilities, operations and maintenance of facilities, and other Commonwealth and University priorities.

2020-2021 Proposed Undergraduate Degree-seeking Tuition and Educational & General (E&G) Fees: The University's proposal assumes that the unrestricted state appropriation will be essentially at the same level as included in the 2018-2020 Appropriation Act. If the unrestricted state appropriation is substantially different from the level assumed, adjustments to these tuition rates may be proposed in Spring 2020. Board members will consider the following proposals to increase undergraduate tuition and E&G fees in 2020-2021:

- *All students in the College of Arts & Sciences, Curry School of Education and Human Development, School of Architecture, McIntire School of Commerce, and School of Continuing and Professional Studies and all returning students in the School of Engineering and Applied Sciences, Batten School of Leadership and Public Policy, and School of Nursing: between 3% and 4%.*

2020-2021 Proposed Mandatory Non-E&G Fees: Mandatory non-E&G fees are proposed to increase between 3% and 6%. The majority of this increase is associated with an expansion of student health and wellness services and operating costs associated with a new student health and wellness facility.
