ACTION REQUIRED: None

BACKGROUND: The University publicly launched the *Honor the Future* campaign on October 12, 2019. At the launch, the University announced that it had reached \$2.75B in commitments, surpassing the 50% mark of the University-wide \$5B campaign goal. The University continues to track ahead of schedule, and through February 12, campaign-to-date totals were at \$2.95B, with 59% achieved against the overall goal. Across the Grounds, most of our schools/units have also surpassed the 50% mark against their individual campaign goals.

Year-to-date as of February 12, alumni, parents, and friends of the University have committed more than \$365M against an ambitious goal of \$500M for FY 2020. In particular, nearly \$100M has been committed in planned gifts. Philanthropic cash flow for FY 2020 stood at \$260M, an increase of 54% compared to the previous fiscal year.
