AGENDA ITEM: III. Fundraising and Campaign Progress Report

ACTION REQUIRED: None

BACKGROUND: Philanthropic cash flow measures actual gifts received by the University during a specific fiscal year. It includes cash or cash equivalents received for philanthropic purposes; it does not include pledges or future support (bequest expectancies, annuities, etc.). Total commitments represent the combination of new commitments (new gifts, private grants, bequests, deferred gifts, donor-advised fund gifts, and non-binding commitments) and new future support (expectancies).

Through June 30, philanthropic cash flow for FY 2021 was \$428M, an increase of over 10% compared to the previous fiscal year and the first time the University has surpassed \$400 million. Compounded growth of philanthropic cash flow was one of our priorities in the *Honor the Future* campaign. Since the first year of the campaign in FY14, our annual philanthropic cash flow has grown by over \$200 million. Total commitments for FY 2021 stood at \$507.6M; our fundraising goal for FY 2021 was \$500M. The University exceeded that goal by \$7.6M, or over 1.5%. A major accomplishment considering the environment created by the pandemic and travel restrictions.

Another positive indicator from FY 2021 is Private Grants were \$40.1M compared to \$30.8M for FY 2020. That's an increase of \$9.3M or 30.2%.

The University continues to track ahead of schedule in *Honor the Future* campaign totals, and through August 25, campaign-to-date totals were at 3.6B, with 72% achieved against the overall goal of \$5B.

AGENDA ITEM: IV. Report on Bicentennial Matching Funds

ACTION REQUIRED: None

BACKGROUND: The Bicentennial Scholars Fund was approved by the Board of Visitors as a \$100M Strategic Investment Fund request in December 2016. The program provided a 1:2 match for new endowed undergraduate scholarships that were established with gifts of at least \$100,000 (\$50,000+ for College at Wise scholarships) and fully paid within five years; scholarship gifts of \$1M+ were matched 1:1. The program was expanded in August 2018 with an additional \$100M and the program was modified where only new scholarship endowments that support need-based scholarships established at a minimum of \$1M were to be matched 1:1. An additional \$30M in matching funds was allocated in December 2020 bringing the remaining corpus to \$50M. With the expansion, the program was modified to include matching opportunities for University Achievement Awards and Blue Ridge Scholarships and the first \$10M committed were to be matched 1:1.

As of August 25, 2021, the University has raised \$312.5M in commitments and pledges for Bicentennial Scholarships and those matching funds have leveraged almost \$218.5M in anticipated matching funds from the Strategic Investment Fund ("SIF"). The combined outside commitments and internal matching funds have created 423 new scholarship endowments across Grounds at the undergraduate and graduate level for a total impact of \$531M.

The Bicentennial Professors Fund was created in December 2017 with a commitment of \$75M by the Board of Visitors and was renewed one year later with an additional \$75M, when matching funds from the initial investment were nearly depleted. In March of 2020 an additional \$50M was invested that included unused matching funds from The Democracy and Equity Research Professorship matching program and a new allocation from the SIF.

Through August 25, 2021, the University has raised \$244M in commitments and pledges for Bicentennial Professorships and those matching funds have leveraged almost \$167M in anticipated matching funds from the SIF. The combined outside commitments and internal matching funds have created 118 new professorships across Grounds for a total impact of \$411M.

<u>DISCUSSION</u>: President Ryan will report on the breakdown of matching-fund commitments to-date for scholarships and professorships and the strategy going forward.
