**BACKGROUND:** Philanthropic cash flow measures actual gifts received by the University during a specific fiscal year. It includes cash or cash equivalents received for philanthropic purposes; it does not include pledges or future support (bequest expectancies, annuities, etc.). Total commitments represent the combination of new commitments (new gifts, private grants, bequests, deferred gifts, donor-advised fund gifts, and non-binding commitments) and new future support (expectancies).

Finishing out the first half of FY 2022, fundraising progress for the University continues to surpass previous fiscal year totals. Through December 31, total commitments for FY 2022 stood at \$322M, an increase of nearly 82% compared to FY 2021, and philanthropic cash flow was \$306M, an increase of 46%.

Due to the generosity of our alumni, parents, and friends, the University continues to track ahead of schedule in our fundraising totals for the *Honor the Future* campaign. Through January 28, 2022, campaign-to-date totals were at \$3.9B, with over 78% achieved against the overall goal of \$5B.
