DISCUSSION: The McIntire School of Commerce teaches two introductory accounting courses to students at the University – COMM 2010, Introduction to Financial Accounting, and COMM 2020, Introduction to Managerial Accounting. These courses are prerequisites for the Commerce School, and they fulfill requirements for students in other programs across the University as well. Approximately 1,000 students enroll in COMM 2010 each academic year, and 550 enroll in COMM 2020. Historically, students took these courses in large lecture settings in class sizes of about 160 students.

McIntire is transitioning to offer these two courses as online courses. By Spring 2018, COMM 2010 will be exclusively online, and COMM 2020 will follow in Fall 2018. Mr. Roger D. Martin, Associate Dean for Academic Innovation and KPMG Professor of Professional Accounting at McIntire, has managed this transition and will be the instructor for both courses when they are fully online. Mr. Martin will discuss the School's motivation for this transition, their experience in developing these courses, and how they have designed the courses to leverage the benefits of e-Learning while maintaining academic rigor and student learning experience quality.
