Institutional Control

NCAA Constitution, Article 6:

The control and responsibility for the conduct of intercollegiate athletics shall be exercised by the institution itself and the division and conference of which it is a member. A member institution's president or chancellor has ultimate responsibility and final authority for the conduct of the intercollegiate athletics program and the actions of any board in control of that program.

 Athletics Compliance Office – Responsible for educating all constituents about NCAA rules, interpreting NCAA rules, and monitoring all aspects of the intercollegiate athletics program.



Representative of Athletics Interests ("Boosters")

- UVA is responsible for the actions of all boosters.
- Boosters include, but are not limited to, individuals or entities that:
 - Promote UVA's intercollegiate athletics program (e.g., VAF, apparel sponsor);
 - Donate to the athletic department;
 - Are a former student-athlete; and
 - Are a UVA employee, Board of Visitor member or similar type of position.
- A booster retains such status forever.



Recruiting

- Prospective Student-Athlete An individual who is in 9th through 12th grade.
- NCAA rules outline when an athletic department can start recruiting a prospective studentathlete, and who can engage in On-Grounds and Off-Grounds recruiting:
 - Only coaches are permitted to recruit Off-Grounds.
 - Boosters (including Board of Visitors members) cannot make recruiting contact with a prospective student-athlete On-Grounds or Off-Grounds.



Extra Benefits

- Extra Benefits Any special arrangement provided to a student-athlete or his/her family (or friend) that isn't permitted by NCAA rules.
 - Examples: Loan from a booster, guarantee of a bond from a booster, providing a student-athlete an automobile (or use of an automobile), signing or cosigning a note/loan for a student-athlete.
 - If the benefit or arrangement is available to all students, or their family, then it isn't an
 extra benefit.



Student-Athlete Employment & NIL Opportunities

- Student-athletes can be employed but must:
 - Perform work for the compensation received; and
 - Be compensated a rate commensurate with the individual's education and experience.
- Name, Image & Likeness ("NIL")
 - Virginia law permits student-athletes to engage in NIL opportunities.
 - NCAA rules preclude pay-for-play and recruiting inducements.
 - UVA cannot compensate student-athletes for NIL.
