SUBJECT: Minutes of the Meeting of the Health System Board on December 10, 2020

The Health System Board met, in Open Session, by electronic communication means at 1:00 p.m., on Thursday, December 10, 2020. Dr. L.D. Britt, Chair, presided.

Opening Remarks from the Chair

Dr. Britt opened the meeting by welcoming everyone and called on Dr. Kent to make remarks.

Opening Remarks from the EVP for Health Affairs

Dr. Kent introduced Lisa Badeau, the new Chief Marketing Officer, and Jason Lineen, Chief Strategy Officer, and asked Dr. Wilkes to introduce two new department chairs.

Dr. Wilkes introduced Harald W. Sontheimer, Ph.D, as the new chair of the Department of Neuroscience, and Peggy McNaull, M.D., as the new chair of the Department of Anesthesiology and Professor of Pediatrics.

Dr. Kent announced searches that are underway, including a search for a chief diversity and community engagement officer and for the dean of the School of Medicine. A search for a chief ambulatory operations officer is also in the early stages.

Wendy Horton said the Medical Center received a certificate of public need for 84 new beds in the new patient tower, taking the total number of beds from 612 beds to 696. She said there are an additional three floors that are unoccupied and available to accommodate growth.

Ms. Horton said she was very pleased to announce that the Medical Center was redesignated as a Magnet Organization. This is the highest national honor for nursing care and nationwide only 10% of hospitals are able to achieve this honor. It is a testament to the exceptional level of care the team provides, including the close collaboration and partnership with the School of Nursing.

Dr. Kent said they were proud of being just short of a 700-bed hospital, and if the Transitional Care Hospital is added in it is over 700 beds.

Graduate Medical Education (GME) Report

Dr. Kent introduced Susan Kirk, M.D, the Designated Institutional Officer for Graduate Medical Education. Dr. Kirk explained that GME includes residents and fellows. Residents and fellows are the professionals who have already graduated from a school: medical school, dentistry school, or pharmacy school, and have matched or enrolled to spend the next three, five, or seven years to go into subspecialty programs and specialty programs. Training programs include basic primary care, family medicine, and pediatrics, to the most highly specialized fellowships such as orthopedic foot and ankle, where you specialize in a certain part of the body. The programs vary a great deal in size; there are over 100 Medicine residents and many of the specialized fellowships are only a single person program, with many in between. All of the programs and the sponsoring institutions have a favorable accreditation status. The accreditation site visit was in October and went fine, and they are preparing for a study and 10-year accreditation visit over the next 18 months to two years. Geographically, the group of interns and residents are diverse, and almost 100% of the positions are filled by graduates of U.S. medical programs. Each year they take a few international medical graduates who are the best and brightest in their country.

Dr. Kirk focused on issues that have occupied the GME program's time this year. She said the first was COVID-19 which had a profound effect on training. They had to convert to virtual and remote learning and taking care of patients in that environment. She said she was proud of how smoothly that went. In the early spring, cases and procedures that are necessary for board certification were limited in some specialties, so they were worried about graduates being able to sit for their boards. They managed to address each situation individually and everyone that graduated in June had the case numbers they needed.

Dr. Kirk said three things happened that are going to stay with us for a while and may turn out to be a silver lining: ramping up learning in simulation, which is a good way for residents and fellows to practice their skills before they go on to take care of patients; telemedicine training for all; and creating hybrid learning platforms. The learners are exposed to more programming now than they were prior to March.

Dr. Kirk mentioned that the program went through a period around 2017 when they received a great deal of negative publicity around diversity and inclusion, and yet the program has grown and improved. She credited Dean Wilkes, who stood in front of them and gave them the charge to make this a focus, as well as department chairs, program directors, diversity officers, faculty, and the passionate and hardworking people in the GME office. She said their efforts around diversity, equity, and inclusion have been substantial, and she gave some illustrations. She said the single most important thing they have done is to be honest and transparent about the past, both recent and more historical, and to be very sincere in convincing applicants that they really want them here. The House Staff Council for Diversity and Inclusion, known as the HCDI, deserves a great deal of credit. Two examples of their work during the pandemic: they collected, boxed, and delivered science, technology, engineering, and math school supplies to Charlottesville families, and they designed and implemented a training diversity and inclusion symposium; this year they had almost 200 participants.

21st Century Therapies: Systematizing the Serendipity

Dr. Kent introduced Jayakrishna Ambati, M.D., Professor of Ophthalmology. His area of scientific expertise is macular degeneration, and discoveries from his laboratories have produced 27 patents. He is a founding director for the Center for Advanced Vision Science, and he is supported by the Strategic Investment Fund to expand his approach in drug discovery to uncover new treatments for diseases such as Alzheimer's, diabetes, multiple sclerosis, and more.

Dr. Ambati said they are on a quest to end blindness caused by macular degeneration, and what they did for one disease they now want to do for hundreds of diseases. Our brains are wired almost as if they exist only to see. We perceive the world and its beauty first and foremost through our eyes, and when we lose this sense, as can happen in people with macular degeneration, it can be devastating. It affects 200 million people worldwide, dwarfing Alzheimer's disease and most cancers combined in prevalence. The retina lets you see the world in high definition. The mystery his team has been focused on solving is why it dies in this disease. They discovered in macular degeneration a toxic substance which activates a part of the immune system, a kind of molecular juggernaut that kills the retina. They found that one class of drugs used by HIV patients also blocks the inflammation. He said they wondered whether people already taking these HIV drugs were protected against degeneration and they created a large database, finding that the rate of macular degeneration was 70% less with people taking these antiretroviral drugs. They found one drug for one disease by chance, so they thought why not find hundreds of drugs for multiple diseases on purpose?

As they were getting the project going, the world changed with the arrival of COVID-19. Hydroxychloroquine was touted as a great treatment, so to test that theory they tapped into the nation's largest integrated healthcare system, the Veteran's Administration (VA). Within weeks they were able to determine that hydroxychloroquine was not only not beneficial but was associated with increased mortality. As this was a matter of urgent public health importance, they released a preprint of an article on their finding themselves and caused a political fury. The study was published on the morning of April 21 and that afternoon the National Institutes of Health (NIH) changed its guidelines on using hydroxychloroquine to treat COVID-19 and issued a cautionary note on using it against the disease. Importantly, his group correctly predicted the outcome of randomized clinical trials run by the NIH, the World Health Organization, and many other agencies that came to the same conclusion but did so months later. He said this example shows the true power of big data archeology: assembling the largest databases of over 150 million patients.

Dr. Ambati provided other examples of using big data archeology to discover existing drugs that could be used to treat diseases other than the ones already known to have efficacy. For instance, the use of Prozac to prevent macular degeneration. He gave examples of repurposing existing drugs to treat diabetes and multiple sclerosis as well. He said they have filed eight new patents, started a new biotech company, and saved countless people from a harmful drug (hydroxychloroquine), and these exciting examples are the tip of the iceberg. They want to use the power of big data archeology to do good by expanding the horizon and multidimensional search for all drug disease associations to process through the thousands of FDA approved drugs and tens of thousands of disease codes, using a powerful approach they call the Three M's, which combine medical expertise with machine intelligence and mathematical algorithms to unearth a vast array of new therapies from old drugs. This intelligent data archeology approach can shave years off the time and billions off the cost of new drug development. He said UVA could be a world leader in a pioneering approach to discovering effective new uses of existing drugs. He said this is what differentiates and distinguishes an academic medical center because they approach all learning as a vehicle for discovery and an opportunity for doing good.

Closed Session

Strategic personnel recruitment and retention, financial, investment, facility needs, market considerations, growth initiatives, partnerships, and other resource considerations and efforts in light of market and regulatory changes for the Health System and expected impact for Fiscal Year 2021, including proprietary information related to COVID-19; all of which further the strategic initiatives of the Medical Center, the School of Medicine, and the Transitional Care Hospital and include employee performance and other proprietary metrics;

Proprietary information regarding compliance with relevant federal and state legal requirements and legislative and accreditation standards, in consultation with legal counsel;

Medical Center and Transitional Care Hospital quality and patient safety, including privileged and proprietary physician practice and performance issues and report from the HSB Quality Subcommittee; and

Medical Center and Transitional Care Hospital Clinical Staff credentialing and privileging and reports from the president of the Medical Center Clinical Staff and the Transitional Care Hospital Clinical Staff.

The relevant exemptions to the Virginia Freedom of Information Act authorizing the discussion and consultation described above are provided for in Sections 2.2-3711(A)(1), (6), (7), (8), and (22) of the <u>Code of Virginia</u>. The meeting of the Health System Board is further privileged under Section 8.01-581.17 of the <u>Code of Virginia</u>."

At 3:15 p.m., the committee concluded closed session and upon the following motion certified that the closed session included only matters identified in the motion authorizing closed session and lawfully exempted from open meeting requirements. Health System Finance Report from the Finance Working Group

Mr. Lischke provided the UVA Health finance report through September 30, 2020. He said discharges are in line with budget and although inpatient activity is lagging this is made up in outpatient activity. The case mix index was very high which helps financially but very sick patients impact length of stay numbers. It is difficult to get patients discharged quickly especially considering staffing shortages.

Mr. Lischke said surgeries remain strong—physicians are very productive. The research enterprise shows a dip in research expenditures which is related to the pandemic. Closed labs and frozen funding have had an impact. Looking to the future, the system will need investments in space and attracting and retaining core faculty.

Mr. Lischke spoke about the School of Nursing and staffing of nurses in the Medical Center. He said they are putting in place processes to recruit and retain School of Nursing students. This has been a trend in recent years that they hope will continue.

Mr. Lischke showed a slide of operating income by major enterprise and he said everything is in line or favorable to plan primarily due to the lifting of furloughs et cetera in July. He said if they can continue to staff the beds they will hit their targets for the fiscal year.
