



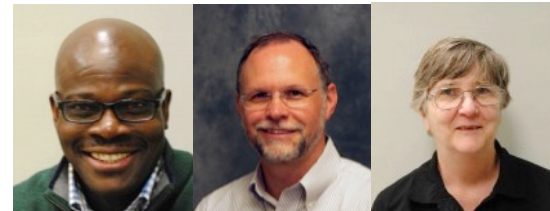

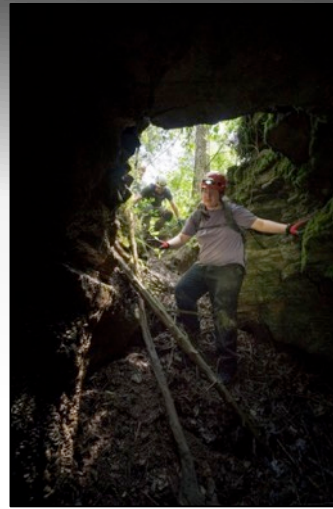

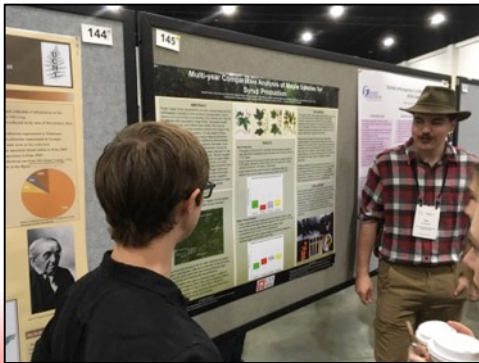

The largest NSF award to UVA-Wise  
Highly competitive program: 500 proposals ~75 awards



Inspiration: Talented UVA-Wise students who face obstacles to completing degrees in STEM fields due to their socio-economic status.



# \$650,000.00 grant

Funding Period: August 2019 – July 2024



- 12 first years may receive \$5000.00 per year for four years
- 13 transfer students may receive \$5000.00 per year for 2 ½ years
- 2 cohorts
  - 2019-2023
  - 2020-2024

The Award was Made to Test The Efficacy of Six Approaches to Retaining Financially Needy Students in STEM Fields and Prepare Them for Graduate School or the Work Force

- 1) Freshmen and Transfer Success Coaching
- 2) General Chemistry Coaching
- 3) Close Faculty Mentoring
- 4) Writing in the Natural Sciences
- 5) Research Experiences
- 6) STEM-Based Industry Summer Internship Program

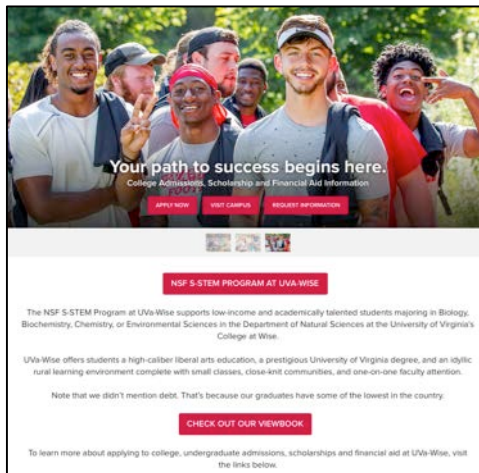

# National Science Foundation is “betting” on us

## Challenges

- Enrollment, Enrollment, Enrollment
  - Find and attract talented (financially needy) students
- Recruitment (Now – April)
  - Josephine Rodriguez and the office of admissions and financial aid



- Visiting area high schools, superintendents, and tour groups
- Visiting area community colleges
- Distributing flyers
- Admitted students receive a letter from Josephine
- Web presence

- Low enrollment threatens many aspects of successfully implementing a program like this
  - Administrative assistants and facilities maintenance
